

Going to camp? A concert? A mission trip?

Sometimes youth ministry events involve long car rides. Below are some games to enjoy the time together.

20 Questions – Have one player or team think of a person, place, or object. Have the opposing player or team ask 20 yes-or-no questions in order to guess the person, place, or thing. If you get to 20 questions and nobody has gotten the right answer, the first player or team wins the point.

Name That Tune – Create a playlist with songs varying in era and genre. Have one person play a roughly ten second clip of the song. Who ever is the quickest to guess the correct song wins a point.

Guess The Biblical Figure – Come up with some creative descriptions of biblical figures and see if the members of your group can guess them. For example, the clue “The hairiest man in the Bible” could be used to describe Esau.

Story Telling By The Whole Group – Have one person begin a story by giving a sentence or two – the more creative and specific, the better. Go around the car and have each member of the group continue with another line or two. See how creative your team can be!

Categories: Choose a broad topic such as sports, board games, TV shows, cities, types of cereal, flowers, movies, etc. Then name something within that category. For example, if your chosen category is “Fruits,” the first player might say “Apples.” The next player would choose another flower, and so on. Play continues until a player can’t think of an item that fits in the category or incorrectly names an item (e.g. “Zucchini” for the “Fruit” category.)
